Symptoms of cow's milk allergy can include:

- Skin reactions
- Digestive problems
- Hay fever-like symptoms
- Eczema that does not improve with treatment
- Or more seriously - swelling in the mouth, wheezing, cough, shortness of breath

The DREAM Study is looking at whether a particular feeding regimen will help infants overcome their allergy after one year

If your child is 5-12 months old and is fed with formula (exclusively or combined), they may be eligible to take part
