It is common for the epilepsy services to look after people who have epilepsy alongside functional seizures and those young people who are going through a diagnostic process – those who are undergoing investigation. In the event that these patients are not diagnosed with epilepsy, the services continue to provide ongoing support to the Young People and their families for a period of time alongside input from health psychology. Patients would be discharged at the point that their conditions are being effectively managed.
